






LDI NORTH RECAP

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RUNNING FOR SECTION/STATE OFFICE

FBLA section and state officers have the unique opportunity to create lasting change within the organization on a large scale. Members who are interested in seeing positive change happen at the section and state levels, are encouraged to run for office. Applications for section office, including Section President, are due December 16th, 2018 and applications for the four state office positions, other than Section President, are due March 8th, 2019. Potential candidates should carefully review the officer guidelines to ensure they have the necessary qualifications to run. Once the application has been submitted to the Section Director and the State Officers' Adviser, applicants will be contacted to schedule an interview. Interviews may be in person or by phone. The interview helps the section and state teams to get to know the potential candidate and their qualifications in order to determine who will be allowed to campaign. The Section Director and officers will then notify who has been selected to run for office and those individuals may begin to prepare their campaign. All candidates should review the 2019-2020 Candidate Guide, which can be found on the CA FBLA website, before completing an application. Being a section or state officer is a life changing opportunity. Be the change you want to see in CA FBLA; together we can Create, Lead, and Inspire!!
