**PALM SPRINGS HS** 

Palm Springs's FBLA chapter has recruited 40 members and hosts meetings twice a week! So far, they have attended the Inland Officer Adviser Training (OAT) Day, Leadership Development Institute (LDI), trained a new officer team, and had a t-shirt design contest. In the future, they plan to complete more champion chapter activities, host a March of Dimes (MOD) fundraiser event, offer competitive event workshops, and prepare activities for American Enterprise Day and FBLA week.

One of the biggest chapters in the nation last year with over 800 registered members, ERHS FBLA has been diligently working within their chapter and around the community! In addition to attending OAT and LDI, Roosevelt FBLA has hosted a community-wide 9/11 ceremony involving local firefighters, police officers, government officials, and school district board members, guest speakers from the City of Eastvale, interschool socials, competitive events workshops, and several other community service events. They have also kickstarted the completion of projects, like Workplace Wellness and the Government Awareness Project (GAP), with over 30+ submissions. They have assembled American Enterprise Day, MOD, Partnership with Business, and Community Service committees and welcomed new officers to their team. As of now, they are preparing for MOD, competitive events, and project workshops. Furthermore, they are planning on completing every section of the Champion Chapter program to earn the Gold Seal again!

Here is one of their pro tips: "We use a google classroom for project submissions, which has been incredibly effective. It's easier to organize and more members complete projects as it shows the assignment actually assigned to them!" - Emily Chen, Communications Director





With a whopping 160 members and weekly officer and member meetings, Los Osos HS FBLA has some impressive stats! They have selected a 20+ person officer team, hosted 1 social, delivered 2 officer presentations at general meetings, hosted 1 guest speaker from the medical field, held 7 general meetings and 8 officer meetings, began 4 committee projects, and more! They trained their officers back in April, participated in OAT Day, attended LDI with their chapter, started writing monthly chapter newsletters, and began preparing for the Inland Section, State, and National Leadership Conferences.

As for future plans, Los Osos is working to prepare monthly fundraisers, weekly study sessions to prepare members for competition, weekly project workdays for Workplace Wellness, all state chapter projects, and BAAs, participation in sponsored educational programs, and 100% completion of Champion Chapter. To achieve these goals, they have developed 6 committees called Partnership with Business, American Enterprise, Community Service, Lead 4 Change, March of Dimes, and Cal-HOSA to involve members in yearlong projects.

The Inland Section is exceptionally proud of these chapters! Hopefully, you can get inspiration from these chapters about potential activities and events to bring back to your FBLA Chapter.
