#### Food:



### **Community Service Awards**

Future Business Leaders of America is competitions, travel, conferences, and family. However, a core aspect of our aweinspiring organization is community service. This year, our section team had the goal of expanding community service.

With the Community Service Awards (CSAs), any FBLA member can be recognized for outstanding participation in one's community. At the first level, Community, members are recognized for 50 hours of community service. For Service, members are recognized for 200 hours. The last level, with National recognition, is for members who have completed 500 hours of community service. For CSA recognition, your hours will be approved by your adviser through the www.fbla-pbl.com website and the new national CSA system. Your CSA hours are due on March 1, 2020.

Community service projects range from canned food donations to book drives. Start one up at your chapter and get involved in your community! You can even partner with local nonprofit organizations to create a community service project within your school's FBLA chapter!
