. What is the Inland Section Council?

The Inland Section Council is a group of FBLA members who want to contribute toward leading and improving the Inland Section. Council members represent their chapter at the section level, exchange ideas with other chapter representatives on how to best serve members, and work with the section officer team to accomplish our Program of Work (POW) goals.

Who can be a part of the Inland Section Council?

One member from each local chapter may represent their chapter on the section level. However, we do ask that the chapter representative not be a senior in order to help the next generation of FBLA leaders foster valuable experiences. Otherwise, as long as a member is eager to get more involved in FBLA and have new ideas concerning our POW goals, they're qualified to apply.

What can you gain from being a part of the Inland Section Council?

Section Council allows council members to work closely with the section executive team, which allows them to gain experience with working at the section level. This experience can help members decide whether or not they'd like to run for section, state, or even national office. In addition, council members get to make connections with members from different chapters across the section. Overall, Section Council allows members to get more involved with FBLA and develop leadership skills which enhance their service to their local chapter.

What's new about the Inland Section Council this year?

This year, in order to better involve council members with work at the section level, the section team has established three committees focused around our POW goals that each council member can participate in. The Unity committee works with social media and connects members together, the Career Opportunities committee connects members with businesses and helps members find the career pathways which suit them best, and the Member Resources committee connects members with the resources they need the most and compiles and shares how each chapter contributes to accomplishing the section POW goals.

PROJECTS OVERVIEW

In the midst of all the chaos surrounding the uncertainty of almost everything in our lives, projects are here for you! Despite the changes the year may bring, projects are one of the areas that will remain relatively unaffected. Whether you're an FBLA veteran, or a firstyear, projects are for you! At the section level, section projects are a collection of activities that revolve around a specific theme or objective. These activities are each allotted a certain number of points. To complete a project, you must complete activities that have a combined sum equal to or exceeding the threshold of points set for that project. The section projects this year are Inland Stays Fit, FBLA Speaks Up, and Inland Honors Society. For example, Inland Stays Fit involves submitting documentation of participating in sports and doing group exercise with your chapter, among other activities. Once the required amount of points are earned, the activity log and documentation must be submitted to your chapter adviser for review, who will then submit it to our Inland Officer Team. Projects are an integral part of FBLA, and completing them helps you develop

leadership valuable skills relating to organizing events, public relations, and more! Doing projects can often earn service hours as well, depending on the activity. The next level of projects are those at the state level. These projects involve more commitment, and are separated into two categories: chapter and individual projects. Submitting these projects involves going through the digital badging system, further details of which can be found on cafbla.org. For those just looking to get started, I highly recommend starting with section projects, and eventually working your way up to a state individual project, or even helping to organize a chapter level one! This year in particular, we may need to adjust the projects to reflect social distancing protocols, which will be sent out to you all very soon. Especially now, projects are a great way to continue to stay involved in FBLA, and receive for recognition your commitment and accomplishments. 
ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT


ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT




